Only 10 percent of charities evaluated by Charity Navigator, America's largest and most-utilized rating agency, have been given the coveted four-star rating for the past three years in a row. AAUW is one of these few! That means that AAUW efficiently applies your generous donations to efforts that achieve our mission — advancing equity for women and girls.





2013 Impact Grant Advances Advocacy

The AAUW Convention in New Orleans was the occasion for the announcement that **Michigan** was again selected to receive a 2013 AAUW Public Policy Impact Grant. Other states and combined state projects receiving grants are: Illinois, Mississippi, New Jersey, New York,

Pennsylvania, Virginia, Wyoming, Illinois-Missouri and Oregon-Washington.

The 2013 Impact Grant awarded to AAUW of Michigan will focus on two priority issues:

- Pay Equity issues including advocacy for legislation at both the federal and state levels of government;
- **Human Trafficking in Michigan**. Two AAUW of Michigan state board members, President Janet Watkins and Membership V.P. Penny Larsen, Ed. D., are members of the Michigan Human Trafficking Task Force (MHTTF) and will share information for branch members to use in their programming and their branch action plans.

AAUW Supports the *Economic Agenda for Women and Families* recently revealed by House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) and House Democrats

This year, our nation marks the 165th Anniversary of the Seneca Falls Convention, the first women's rights convention that addressed women in social, economic and political life. The Declaration of Sentiments and Resolutions at the convention recognized the potential of women's contributions to our nation and demanded that women be granted all the rights and privileges that men possessed.

American women have made great strides since that historic gathering – but there is more work to do to provide women with the economic security and opportunities they deserve and their families need.

That is why House Democrats are offering the *When Women Succeed, America Succeeds:* An Economic Agenda for Women and Families-an agenda that stands on the shoulders of what was accomplished at Seneca Falls by addressing the economic challenges facing women and families today.

PAY - The Problems: Fifty years after President John F. Kennedy signed the Equal Pay Act into law, women continue to earn less than men:

- Women make only 77 cents for every dollar earned by men, amounting to a yearly gap
 of \$11,084 between full-time men and women. That \$11,084 lost could purchase 89
 more weeks of food or more than 3,000 additional gallons of gas or more than one year
 of rent for a woman's family.
- For African American women and Latinas the pay gap is even larger. African American women on average earn only 64 cents and Latinas on average earn only 55 cents for every dollar earned by white, non-Hispanic men.
- The minimum wage is a women's issue; nearly two-thirds of minimum wage workers are women. Yet the minimum wage has not kept up with inflation over the last 45 years – with the minimum wage now, in inflation-adjusted terms, more than 30 percent lower than it was in 1968.

- Paycheck Fairness
- Increase Minimum Wage (Including Tipped)
- Invest in Job Training and Education Opportunities
- · Protect and Restore Employment Rights
- Support Women Entrepreneurs/Small Businesses
- Pregnant Workers Fairness
- Adequate Tools to Investigate Wage Discrimination
