

AAUW National Election

The 2015 election was a great success, with 12 percent of the membership voting — more than double the 5% quorum required by Association bylaws.

All proposed bylaws and public policy changes passes <u>except</u> for eliminating the degree requirement with 56% voting "No."

Early next week the Senate will vote on the **Every Child Achieves Act** (ECAA), the first major update to federal K-12 education laws since the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Yet, incredibly, the legislation would eliminate the Women's

Demand More Than the Symbolic Change

While strides have been made since the Equal Pay Act was signed into law in 1963, women are still paid on average only <u>78 cents</u> to every dollar paid to men. And things aren't getting much better. Our research shows that the gender pay gap has barely budged in a decade. At the current rate, the gap won't close for another 124 years, or until 2139.

The US Treasury asked for feedback on the design to have a **woman appear on the \$10 bill** which will be unveiled in 2020 - AAUW provided their feedback below:
